Last year, many of the Kindergartens had the opportunity to raise painted lady butterflies and tadpoles, watching their life cycles unfold. This year, they'll experience a whole new life cycle. Once we've completed a few more building challenges, we'll launch into an insect investigation and get ready to host our new fruit-fly munching friends. Did you know? Mantis grow to over 700 times their original size within just a few weeks! They can live up to 8 months in captivity. Though not a native species here, Agriculture Canada has approved the Chinese praying mantis for release nationwide, so they can be released into gardens and green spaces for natural pest control. Can't wait to meet our new guests!
